100% Support for AUF is Vital

At the end of September, Annual Conference giving to the Africa University Fund (AUF) stood at 51%.

The overall asking is \$2,358,000 and traditionally, most of the funds are remitted at year's end. However, a number of annual conferences have already sent in more than two thirds the funds needed for them to reach a 100% investment.

"Africa University (AU) really relies on the strong support of the local church," said James Salley, the university's associate vice chancellor for institutional advancement. "These gifts help us to provide crucial learning resources and pay for lecturers and utilities. To fulfill and grow our mission, we need all 59 annual conferences to invest 100% of their asking to the AUF."

In 2012, 27 annual conferences reached that 100% goal and the Wisconsin Conference led the way.

"People in Wisconsin like to see their money go to worthy causes," says

Lisa King, the conference treasurer. "They recognize that Africa University is an inspirational example of what we can achieve together in the United Methodist Church. Africa University provides the education needed so that Africans can go back to their nations and provide leadership and a positive impact throughout their lifetimes."

In 2011, local churches in the Wisconsin Conference invested 151% to the AUF. Last year, the conference pushed its giving even higher, to 169% and helped the North Central Jurisdiction to reach 100% in overall giving to the AUF for the first time.

Visit Inspires Teenager to Raise Scholarship Funds

Fairness is really important to 15-year-old Georgie Wood. On a visit to Africa University in March, she learned that when they're confronted with financial hardships, African families often decide to send boys to college, rather than girls.

"I saw first-hand how appreciative the students are of the opportunity to go to school and that it can truly make a huge difference in their lives," said Georgie. "It really inspired and moved me."

Touched by how thankful the students she encountered were, an idea was born. When she got home to Ridgefield, Connecticut, Georgie Wood launched an effort to raise funds for a scholarship. Her goal is around \$24,000—\$6,000 a year for four years—enough to help a female student to enroll and complete a degree at Africa University.

On her 15th birthday in May, Georgie asked her family and friends for scholarship donations in lieu of gifts. With her parents support, she has already raised about \$2,400. This effort "to empower women in Africa" is now the centerpiece of Georgie's Girl Scout Gold Award project.
